The show

Paul Lorenz & Friends is modern crossover played like a record: the songs of Coldplay, John Miles, ABBA and the great film musicals, next to Paul's own works — including numbers from his London-recorded musical “Why Should I Go – Queen of the Night”.

On stage: an all-professional cast. The lead vocals come from London's West End — the singers of Paul's own musical recordings. Behind them, a hand-picked band with live string and horn sections, directed by Paul from the grand piano.

Every arrangement is produced in stems from Paul's own studio recordings. In the compact formats the string and horn sections play from those recordings — note for note the same score. In the full lineup, everything on stage is live. The show keeps its sound at every size; only the stage gets bigger.

Paul at the piano, a West End lead voice, rhythm section and a solo violin or saxophone.

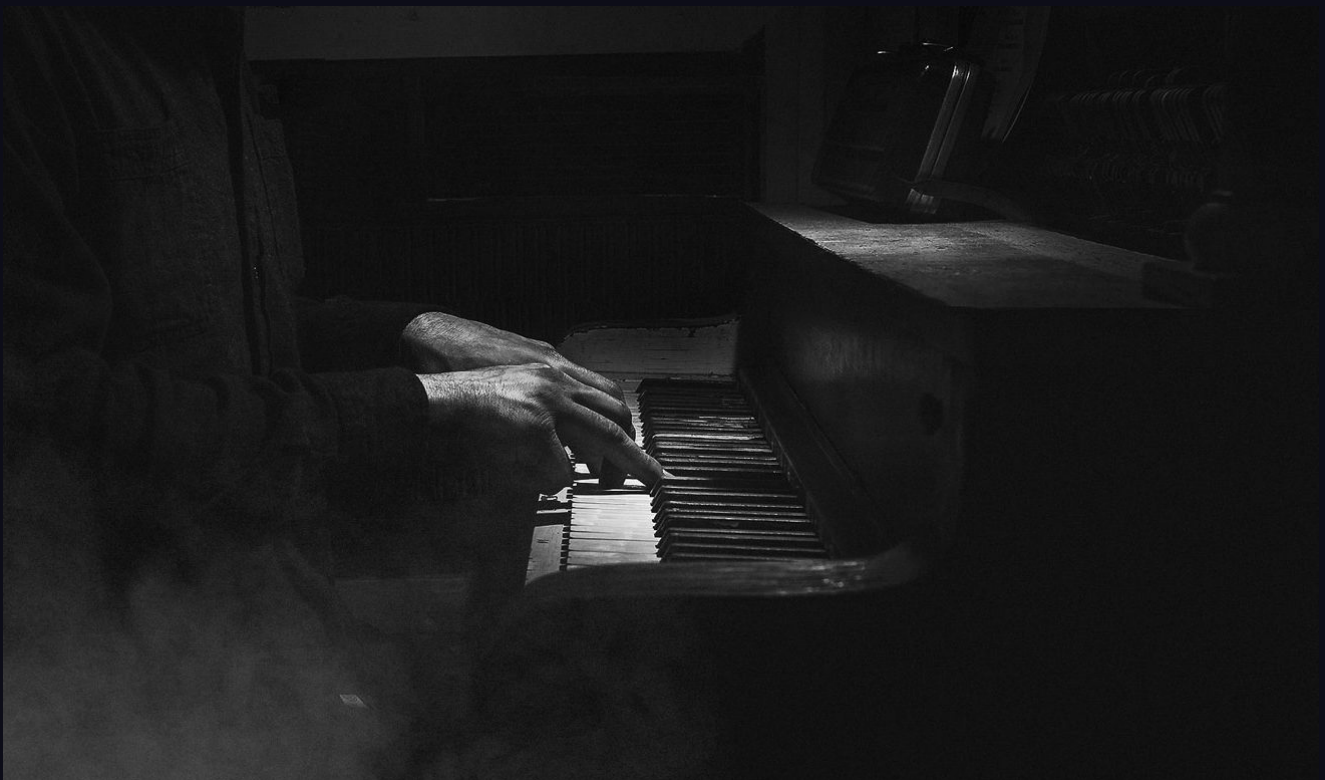


COMPOSER · ARRANGER · MUSICAL DIRECTOR

Paul Lorenz

Austrian composer, arranger and conductor with more than 30 years in the music business — with stations at Universal, Sony, Warner and Bertelsmann. His arrangements and productions have been recorded with the London Symphony Orchestra at Abbey Road Studios, performed at the Vienna State Opera, streamed over 500 million times, and certified Gold and Double Platinum.

Since 2016, “Paul Lorenz & Friends” has filled houses on sold-out concert tours. Today the name stands for an all-professional production: West End voices, orchestral craft, and a sound standard set at Abbey Road.
